## FEES

As an Incoming exchange student, you will pay tuition fees to your home institution based on their fee requirements. However, exchange students shall pay for things such as books and equipment, health insurance, local excursion, accommodation, flight, and a student visa.

## ACCOMMODATION

As soon as you have been accepted a course(s) offered from us, you can request for off-campus accommodation and Presidency University will facilitate incoming students in finding accommodation close to the campus, approximately 7-10 kms. Students are advised to apply for accommodation as soon as possible after accepting an offer letter; so, you have accommodation arranged before your arrival in Bangalore, India.

Note: The university will provide a bus service for all incoming exchange students from partner universities so that they can commute to and from campus.

## CHOOSING MODULES/COURSES

You may take courses across multiple faculties (subject to availability, no guarantees may be given) as long as your course choices are approved by your home university and meet your degree requirements. Most courses are open to Incoming Exchange students. However, some have prerequisites or require permission from the relevant faculty or school before you can enroll in them. Students to enroll prior to their arrival at Presidency University. However, courses need to be finalized within one week of start of the class. All the programmes/courses are taught completely in English.

## ACADEMIC WORKLOAD

Exchange students can take a workload of 12 to 20 credits. The minimum workload is 12 credits and maximum would be 20 credits. It may be considered on the request of the home university on reducing the workload.

PU 01 credit = U.S. 01 credit.

PU 01 credit is 15 teaching contact hours (study period, project, assignments, and examination period is excluded)

## ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS

A student must have a minimum of 75% attendance of the classes actually conducted in that academic term, for which course(s) the student has registered for in the academic term, will be permitted to write the final examination.

## **TRANSCRIPTS**

All credit-bearing exchange students will be issued with a transcript detailing their modules and final grades at the end of the semester, once the exam results have been finalized. Transcript's will be mailed directly to the home university.

## **WHEN SHOULD YOU ARRIVE**

You should arrive at least 7 days prior to the commencement of the term. Late arrival may be accepted under certain conditions such as health or travel/diplomatic restrictions.

## **VISA AND IMMIGRATION REQUIREMENTS**

All international students applying to study in India must have a valid student visa (before travelling to India) unless they have an alternative visa that enables them to study in India. If you are granted a student visa, you must comply with all student visa conditions. For all visa enquiries and applications, please contact your local Indian Embassy/High Commission/Consulate General of India. The visa must be valid for the orientation days before the start of the semester. Find more details by visiting <https://www.mea.gov.in/>

## **INSURANCE**

All international students are required to acquire a health insurance from their home country before their departure. The insurance should cover for medical and evacuation expenses abroad due to accident or sickness for the entire duration of exchange at the host country.

## **FOREIGN REGIONAL REGISTRATION OFFICES (FRRO)**

Foreigner visiting India on Student Visa(S) is required to get himself / herself registered with concerned FRRO, within 14 days of his/her first arrival, irrespective of the duration of his / her stay. FORM-S (Foreign Students Information System) is used to capture information about foreign nationals admitted in Indian educational institutions. Follow the [FRRO link](#) for more details.



## CURRENT ESTIMATED COST OF LIVING\*

According to the study in India, the average cost of living in India (Bangalore) for students is € 140 (A student can experience a comfortable stay for a month).

Living costs will vary depending on lifestyle but it is generally inexpensive to live in Bangalore than other Indian cities, such as Mumbai or Delhi. Here is a breakdown of some general expenses for you to consider when preparing your finances (click for [more details](#)):

## HOW TO APPLY

1. Choose your programme	Are you applying as a Student Exchange/ Study Abroad
2. Check your eligibility	Check that you meet the entry requirements for your program.
3. Discuss your study options with your home university	Consult with your home university to understand the application and credit requirements of studying abroad. If you are from PU exchange partner university, you'll also need home university approval to participate in the exchange.
4. Choose your courses - 12 or 18 credit points	Review the information in this guide and select the appropriate study plan for your program in PU.
5. Apply at PU	<b>Exchange Programme</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◆ Ensure your home university confirms your nomination to PU first.</li> <li>◆ Submit the filled application form with academic transcripts along with essential supporting documents as requested on the application form.</li> </ul>
6. Apply for PU off-campus accommodation	You will receive an acknowledgement of your application
7. Offer letter and study plan	<p>PU will assess your application. If you are successful, PU will email your offer Letter after receiving the confirmation for accommodation and administrative charges.</p> <p>You can start to prepare your study plan. The average timeframe to process applications is two to three weeks.</p>
8. Acceptance and confirmation of enrolment	You must formally accept your offer and, PU will also pre-enroll you in your preferred, approved subjects.
9. Apply for a student visa	Apply for a student visa. Once your student visa has been approved, you should finalize your travel arrangements and insurance. You must obtain an Indian student visa before you can commence study in India.
10. Pre- arrival	PU will send you pre- arrival information regarding accommodation, airport reception and orientation activities.
11. Arrival and Orientation	Arrive in Bangalore, India and attend PU Orientation, which is compulsory for all exchange students. Our comprehensive Orientation programs include information sessions and social activities, to help you get to know PU and meet other new and experienced students. You will also be able to finalize your enrolment and receive your student ID card.
